ATA faculty administrator teaches in Kenya



During a 10-day mission trip to Narok, Kenya, **Lori Moore**, along with a team of 10 from Southeast Christian Church taught 45 adults during a leadership conference and worked with more than 200 African children, many of whom were street children.

Lori learned to speak a limited amount of Swahili and/or Maasi, but had translators repeating everything she taught during the leadership conference. It was a big deal for them to allow a woman to teach to men.

Lori worked primarily with the Maasi tribe in Narok and was given a Maasi name when she left -- "Nasieku", which means "one who gets things done fast."

And the African cuisine? She ate crocodile and ostrich while she was there!

She also spotted zebras, gazelle, monkeys, ostrich, cows, goats, donkeys, and one lion!

We're glad Lori is back and we want to thank her for using her expertise in teaching to help across the world!

FACTS

The mission team took 100 kids by bus from Narok to Nairobi (3 ½ hours each way) to the airport (they had never seen airplanes), a museum, an animal orphanage (zoo) and a tribal dance exhibition (Bomas of Kenya).

Lori worked with about 60 kids from Narok and taught "Conflict Resolution" to local tribal pastors and leaders.

ATA Tips | Questions to expect at an interview

1. **Tell me about yourself.** Meant as an ice-breaker, but keep your answer job-related or skills-focused.

2. **What do you know about our company?** Here's your chance to show you've done your homework.

3. **What are your strengths?** Focus on what makes you a desirable candidate for the job.

4. **Why did you leave your last job?** Answer with a positive statement. Try not to say: "I was fired," "quit," "had no babysitter," or "couldn't get along with coworkers or supervisor". However, you can say: "new job," "contract ended," "seasonal," "temporary," "career change" or "returned to school."

5. **Why have you been unemployed for such a long time?** Be honest. Stress that you were looking for the right company and opportunity or that you needed the time to focus on going back to school.

6. **Why should we hire you?** Make a positive statement, such as "I want the opportunity to work with you and believe that I can do the work."

7. **Do you have references?** Contact your references ahead of time and have their name, current address, and telephone numbers.

BBQ Chicken & Bacon Pizza

2 Italian pizza crusts (6 inch)
1/4 cup barbecue sauce
6 oz. cooked chicken breast (cut)
3/4 cup shredded cheddar or mozzarella cheese
1/4 cup cooked bacon pieces
Red onion


Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Spread pizza crusts with barbecue sauce. Top evenly with chicken breast cuts, cheese, bacon pieces and red onion rings. Place on baking sheet and bake 8-10 minutes or until heated through. Yields: 4 servings
